

Psalm 63:1-4

- ² So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory.
- Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you.
- So I will bless you as long as I live;I will lift up my hands and call on your name.

First English Lutheran Church is located on the near east side of Columbus. They have a dinner that is open to the community every week. Messiah Lutheran supplies dinner on the first Thursday every other month. Our next service date is **June 7.** We strongly encourage youth to come help with this service, but welcome adults, youth and families.

In addition to the community dinner, First English operates a bike shop where bicycles and parts are available at affordable prices and they offer clinics on bicycle repair. They also reach out to their community with a monthly ladies day out, summer block parties and kids camp.

For a little history about First English... it was so named because it was the first congregation in Columbus where services were exclusively in English. Lutherans were in Columbus as early as 1813, but services were performed in German. In the early 1850s, the Lutheran congregation in Columbus split into two groups, Trinity German Evangelical Lutheran and First English, both led by the same pastor and often meeting on the same grounds. The church on Main Street was dedicated on January 5, 1913 and has operated in that location continuously for more than 100 years.
