One of the biggest obstacles to our faith is forgiveness. God calls us not only to receive forgiveness, but to give forgiveness. Holding on to hate of someone else or refusing to reopen a relationship are barriers to our own relationship with God. Yet, the harm we do to each other is real and forgiving someone who has harmed us is difficult. Who could not but hate someone who has broken us, abused us, or stolen something we treasure and love? Who could advise a renewed relationship of love and trust with someone who has proven themselves untrustworthy?

Starting on Messiah Night, Wednesday, January 8, Pastor Karl will lead a four week class exploring forgiveness. We will flesh out the boundaries of what God expects of us and what is not expected of us. We will name the consequences of failing to forgive. We will identify the joy that forgiveness can bring. We will challenge the wisdom of forgiving *everyone*. We will investigate and discuss stories of forgiveness that seem extraordinary.

Joseph's Coat Ends 2019 With Record Numbers



In this last quarter of 2019, Joseph's Coat has seen a record number of new and existing clients needing our help to clothe their families!

We are giving out more clothing and household goods than ever. On a Saturday, we are seeing 100-114 families rather than the "normal" 60-80 families.

On a Wednesday, we are assisting 60 families rather than the 40-45 families earlier in the year. Thankfully, we are receiving large amounts of clothing, but always in need of more coats, especially children's'. We still have a great need for good household items such as pots, pans, dinnerware, crock pots, toasters, coffee pots, electric skillets and toaster ovens. We also need all sizes of sheet sets, blankets, spreads, quilt and comforters, especially in queen size. In general, we need more of everything since we are serving so many clients.
